Thank you for your letter of October 2, 2007 regarding your concerns around the proposed Jumbo Resort development on Farnham Glacier.

At Vancouver 2010 we have always been fully committed to using sustainable solutions to manage the social, economic and environmental footprint of 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games venues and operations. We are developing plans to meet or exceed environmental regulatory requirements and to apply innovative environmental practices at all of our venues. With respect to the environment, we are focusing on areas such as air quality, water quality and consumption, energy conservation and greenhouse gas emissions, sustainable building practices, transportation fleet management, waste reduction and green events and accommodation.

Our intention has never been to develop a year round training facility for the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Games via the proposed Jumbo Resort development. We have worked closely with CODA to assist in the development of the Camp Green training facility on Farnham Glacier, and I understand CODA has advised you of their progress on this facility as well.
